

We received in donations 1699k of food We gave out 3684 k of food feeding 302 people on 135 vouchers

3 of Jack Munroes tweets on the 19th January

This time last year, the cheapest rice at the same supermarket was 45p for a kilogram bag. Today it's £1 for 500g. That's a 344% price increase as it hits the poorest and most vulnerable households.

This time last year, the cheapest pasta in my local supermarket (one of the Big Four), was 29p for 500g. Today it's 70p. That's a 141% price increase as it hits the poorest and most vulnerable households. Baked beans: were 22p, now 32p. A 45% price increase year on year.

Urgently needed Long life fruit juice, Sugar 500g (not larger), potato smash, instant noodles pack/pot, porridge, teabags (40's or 80's), gender neutral roll-on/stick deodorant, gender neutral shampoo, disposable razors, washing up liquid (not bigger than 500ml), single or duo wrapped toothbrushes, toothpaste, size 5 nappies, crisps

Low in stock UHT semi-skimmed milk, UHT whole milk, tinned rice pudding, tinned tomatoes, jam/honey, instant coffee (not decaffeinated), rice, tinned potatoes, ready-made custard (tinned or carton - not powder) laundry power/liquid (not family sized), squash, tinned spaghetti, chocolate and snack bars, tinned/packet vegetarian meal, strong carrier bags, toilet rolls, pet (dog/cat) food

Well stocked Tinned fish, cereal (not greater than 500g), pasta sauce, tinned meat (ham, corned beef, pork sandwich, pulled pork, pulled chicken, tinned fruit in juice (not prunes or grapefruit), instant hot chocolate (not cocoa powder), baked beans, pasta shapes, dry spaghetti, tinned/packet soup, tinned vegetables, biscuits, nappies all sizes, baby food and baby care items, gender neutral shower gel, liquid/bar soap, sanitary pads, baby wipes

Not needed at all Decaffeinated drinks or fruit infusions, bottled water, large bottles of lemonade or coke, any food or toiletries containing alcohol, cooking ingredient or sauces, tinned macaroni cheese, fresh products (including vegetable, meat, eggs and bread), non-dairy items, gluten-free items, coffee beans, loose tea, large boxes of teabags (120's or more), very large bags or boxes of porridge and cereal, cocoa power, tampons, make up hair accessories, perfume or aftershave, Christmas items
