Tinned/carton instant custard, jam/honey, tinned rice pudding, sugar (500g), small jars instant coffee (not decaffeinated), liquid/bar soap.

#### Low stock

Cereal (not greater than 500g), rice (500g), baked beans, tinned spaghetti. tinned tomatoes, tinned meat/meat products. tinned fruit (in juice - not prunes, grapefruit or rhubarb), tinned vegetables (peas, carrots, sweet corn), Pasta sauce, tinned fish (mackerel, tuna, sardines, salmon), tea bags (40's or 80's), chocolate bars, tinned soup, pastas shapes, instant potato, instant noodles, instant hot chocolate (not cocoa powder), UHT long-life fruit juice (not needing refrigeration), UHT semi-skimmed milk, UHT whole milk, squash, tinned/packet vegetarian meals, sugar (500g), toilet rolls, laundry powder/liquid (not family sized), washing-up liquid, toothpaste, gender neutral shampoo and shower gel.
